Clinical requirements for third-year students. 1 Block=4 weeks

Core **Family Medicine** - two blocks
Core **Internal Medicine** - two blocks (one block must be inpatient)
Core **Pediatrics** - one block
Core **OB-GYN** - one block (must include OB deliveries)
Core **Psychiatry** - one block
Core **Surgery** - one block (must include inpatient surgical procedures)
Elective (four weeks) - two blocks - any discipline

Clinical requirements for FOURTH-YEAR students. 1 Block=4 weeks

EM Clinical Requirement - one block
ICU Clinical Requirement - one block
Selective I & II - two blocks (adult/pediatrics subspecialty)
Electives - six blocks - any discipline

Other requirements for clinical rotations

The preceptor of record supervising the student must be a physician.
Clinical Rotation Evaluation is sent electronically to the preceptor to complete at the end of rotation.
