

Scholarships

Scholarships are a form of aid that do not have to be repaid. ATSU utilizes a tool called ScholarshipUniverse that serves to inform both newly admitted and current students of potential internal and external scholarship opportunities. ScholarshipUniverse may be found within the my.atsu.edu portal and helps to streamline the search and application process by presenting only relevant awards based on known criteria specific to the student.

Indian Health Service Scholarship

- Pays tuition and fees, required books, supplies, and equipment
- Pays a monthly stipend
- Year-for-year obligation*
- Must have tribal papers or acceptable documentation

National Health Service Corps Scholarship

- Pays full tuition and fees, required books, supplies, equipment, and student health insurance
- Pays a monthly stipend
- Year-for-year obligation*
- Student must
- Practice primary care (family medicine, general internal medicine, general pediatrics, psychiatry, or OB/GYN)
- Serve in an underserved area of the country
- Two-year minimum
- Visit nhsc.hrsa.gov/scholarships or call 800.221.9393
- Year-for-year obligation requires a student to serve one year for each year the student received benefits.

Federal Direct student loans

About

ATSU graduate and professional students seeking degrees in eligible degree or certificate programs may qualify for a Direct Unsubsidized and/or a Direct Grad PLUS student loan. Contact Enrollment Services with any questions regarding Federal Direct student loans.

Things to know: Interest begins accruing for the borrower when funds are disbursed. The interest rate while in school and throughout repayment is fixed. Visit studentaid.gov to view the current fixed interest rates.

Students have several options when it comes to loan repayment. ATSU encourages students to be informed borrowers and understand the various repayment plan options. Required criteria to apply for a Federal Direct student loan

To be eligible to apply for Federal Direct student loans, a student must:

- Be a U.S. citizen or an eligible noncitizen
- Possess a valid Social Security number
- Enroll or be accepted as a degree-seeking student in an eligible degree or certificate program
- Be enrolled at least half-time
- Maintain satisfactory academic progress
- Not have a record of default on a federal student loan

Applying for Federal Direct student loans

The first step is to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) by using your federal tax return from two years prior. Gather your tax information, and visit studentaid.gov to apply. Please note, ATSU's school code (for all programs) is G02477.

Note: The FAFSA must be completed annually and opens every Oct. 1 for the upcoming academic year.



Federal Direct Unsubsidized Loan

- Maximum borrowing amounts
- Lifetime aggregate limits by program
- Medical or dental students \$47,167 annual limit, \$224,000 lifetime limit
- Master of Public Health programs \$33,000 annual limit, \$224,000 lifetime limit
- Nonmedical or nondental students \$20,500 annual limit, \$138,500 lifetime limit
- Limits are based on a 12-month year and will vary based on the length of the academic year.

Federal Direct Graduate PLUS Loan

- Maximum borrowing amount
- Students may borrow up to the full financial aid offer (cost of attendance) less any Unsubsidized Direct funds received or other gualifying financial assistance.
- Credit: Since borrowers must be creditworthy to qualify for the Grad PLUS Loan. It is recommended students request a free copy of their credit report to check for any errors or discrepancies.

Financial aid offers

Enrollment Services will contact students via their ATSU email with instructions on viewing and accepting their offer, along with other required steps of the financial aid process, including completion of entrance counseling, consent to obtain credit form, and master promissory notes. Financial aid offers will include academic expenses for the loan period, such as tuition and fees, computers, books, supplies, and living expenses. 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
